What is used to determine Child Support?

1

The court will look at pay stubs and also deduct certain expenses like:

- Support payments for other dependents
- Medical insurance payments for children
- Social security, Medicare and railroad retirement withholdings
- Federal and state income tax

When does Child Support end in Arkansas?

3

Generally, child support ends when the child:

- Age 18 or when graduates from high school whichever is later
- Declared emancipated by a court
- Marries
- Dies

When can Child Support be ordered?

2

- When parents decide to get divorced
- When parents are separated

Can also be ordered in cases in which the parents were never married.

When is Child Support Modified?

4

- When there has been a change in the paying parent's gross income of 20% or more than \$100 per month.
